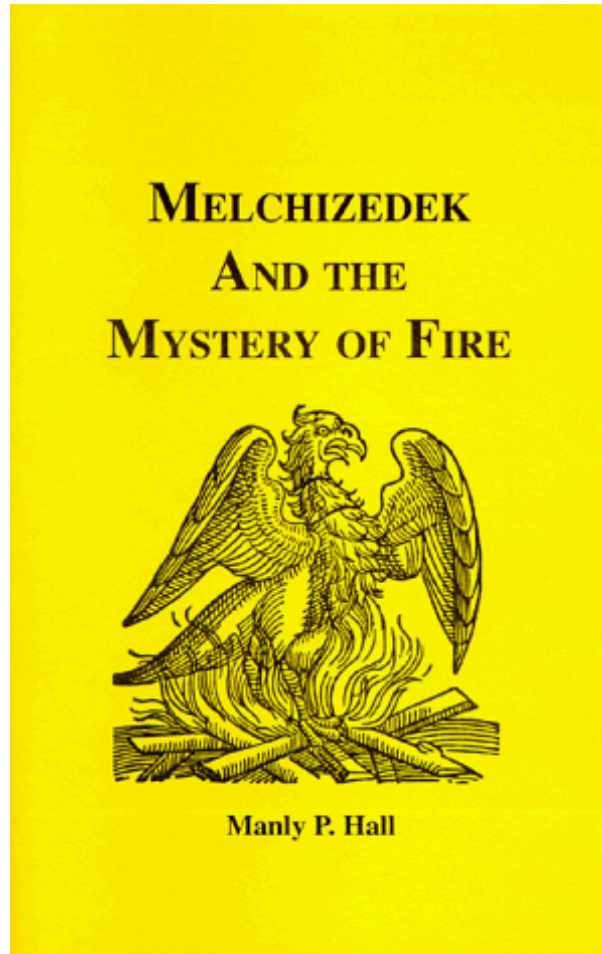

Short and Sweet Introduction to Occultism

Just finished reading this very short book. It's in three parts ... wish I could give a quick synopsis -- perhaps it's best to check out the glowing reviews on amazon.com. I highlighted and underlined quite a bit -- a bit too much to print out the interesting parts here.

The first part is an introduction in defense of the fact that all religions, east and west, have "fire" or "light" as their fundamental deity -- sometimes appearances to the contrary -- but Manly P. Hall is quick to point out that this "fire" is not necessarily physical or material fire, but the fire known as "akasa" or "the astral light" or, several other names, basically it is the "ethereal fire" that is one (Hall says the highest) of the four elements of the ancients.

The content of the second part of "Melchizedek" is a little harder to pin down. Its title "Man, Grand Symbol of the Mysteries" is the same as the title of another entire book by Hall. The chapter is necessarily less detailed, touching mainly on the idea introduced previously that there really are three aspects of the "fire" worshiped by all races, corresponding to the three aspects of man's constitution -- heart (heaven), body (hell), mind (earth, or the middle ground). In the first part he calls these Will (heart, heaven), Action or Friction (earth), and Wisdom or Intelligence (mind, meeting between heaven and earth). I may be a little off on the correspondences, but they're never very clear in occult writings, and when they are, they're often contradicted in other writings.

In any case, the second part also involves a defense of the argument made at the book's outset, namely that almost all, if not all, religious lore, writings, symbolism, processions, rituals, even architecture pertain to certain secret, i.e. occult, knowledge of man's true, spiritual, constitution as well as to the means of achieving spiritual regeneration -- resulting in membership of the highest mystery school on Earth -- according to him - - the order of Melchizedek.

The third part of the book explores the phenomenon of the kundalini energy, the chakra/nadi system as well as the role played by both the pituitary (the mother gland, Isis) and the pineal gland (Osiris?) in achieving spiritual regeneration.

I am perhaps cheating the reader of this review of the many quotable quotes from this short, enjoyable and highly readable book. Compare Hall's easy-reading writing style to a mentor of both his and mine -- the venerable H.P. Blavatsky, whose writing (cf. the *Secret Doctrine*) is often very difficult reading.

Quotes from Melchizedek (this is not representative of the numerous passages I found interesting in the book, but here are a few).

"The auric body of a snake is one of the most remarkable sights that the clairvoyant will ever see, and the secrets concealed within this aura demonstrate why the serpent is the symbol of wisdom among so many nations."

"The golden ornaments upon the altars of Christian churches should remind the philosophical observer that gold is the sacred metal of the sun, because, according to alchemists, the sun ray itself crystallized in the earth, thus forming this precious metal, which, incidentally is still being made."

"The initiates view the blood as a mysterious liquid, somewhat gaseous in nature, which served as a medium for manifesting the fire of man's spiritual nature. This fire, coursing through the system, animated and vitalized all parts of the form, thus keeping the spiritual nature in touch with all of its physical extremities."

"The Egyptians considered the juice of the grape to be more nearly like human blood than any other substance. In fact, they believed that the grape secured its life from the blood of the dead who had been buried in the earth."

"The highest of each kingdom in Nature was considered symbolic of the sun. Hence, the scarab beetle, being the most intelligent of all insects, the eagle the most aspiring of all birds, and the lion the strongest of all beasts were considered fitly symbolic of the solar disc."

BIBLICAL SECRETS AND SECRET CODES REVEALED

First published in 1929. The liver is under the control of the planet Mars. The scarab beetle, the eagle, and the lion are symbols of the sun. Golden crowns of kings with radiating points were symbols that they had partaken part of the divine power of the sun. The halo is also emblematic of sun power. The fire of divinity, the fire of humanity, and the fire of the demons. These three fires are enshrined within the nature of man.

The disciples of the ancient wisdom knew that during the dawn of this earth, the Sons of the Dawn, also known as the gods had arranged certain instructions which were deposited in safe places and after having insured that these doctrines would be preserved in order to save the race, the gods entered into the constitution of man and lost their identity. This is why it is said that the kingdom of heaven is within you. This kingdom of heaven includes the Divine Father, His Trinity, His seraphim, cherubim, powers, dominations, principalities, thrones, angels, and archangels. As heaven is in man's own nature, earth and hell are also in his constitution. Man is the appointed guardian of the mineral spirit. The infernal world is also part of himself. An infernal fire burns at the basis of his spine. It can be traced to the lower emotional centers of the human body. Man is heaven, earth and hell all in one, and his salvation is a much more personal problem than he realizes. Man himself is a galaxy of stars. Brilliant lights that cannot be seen but are felt as ringing sounds in the head. This radiant light is symbolic of the spirit.

The Temples of the Ancients were patterned after the human form; therefore, man's body is a living temple

and he is a high priest, placed there to keep the House of the Lord in order. There are occult keys to human salvation. This is why the knowledge of self is the goal for which the wise of all ages have toiled so hard. This was the hope that sustained ancient initiates to overcome the dangers, disappointments, and sacrifices. Some of these initiates were even aware that the price of this quest for truth would be their own lives.

In Central America, at the height of the Mexican Indian Mysteries the neophytes, among other things had to encounter, in gloomy caverns a creature called the Bat-God who was the size of a man and whose duty was to attempt to decapitate with its razor-sharp edge anyone seeking entrance to the Mysteries.

Fire is the Universal Deity. Mystics have traced sun worship back to early Lemuria and fire worship to the origin of the human race. The Atlanteans were sun worshippers. Remnants of earlier American Indians still regard the sun as a representation of the Supreme Light-Giver.

The twelve houses of the heavens symbolize the twelve signs of the zodiac. The annual death and resurrection of the sun is the esoteric/hidden symbol for the Gods of Christian religions. The Sun of God. The sun is also symbolized by an equilateral triangle. The three phases of the sun are called Will, Wisdom and Action. Please note that when the W in Will is capitalized it means the Universal Will and not the will of man. Every truly intelligent man or woman who is working to spread light in the world is Christ-ened, or Light-ened by the actual labors they seek to perform.

At least in part, Christianity has preserved the primitive fire worship of antiquity. This can be seen in their symbols and rituals. The incense burner used in Christian churches is a pagan symbol which relates to the regeneration of the human soul. Some authorities think that the cross was derived from the ancient Egyptians. Mr. Hall expounds on how others hold that the symbol of the cross had its origins by primitive peoples. Church steeples can be traced to the fire obelisks of Egypt. The custom of having churches face the East is evidence of the survival of sun worship. The golden ornaments of the altars of Christian churches are also a reminder that gold is the sacred metal of the sun. The candles are also a symbol of sun worship. And so is the oil used in anointing.

This is just a brief summary of the contents of this small book, which is worth it's weight in gold.
